Personally, I am delighted by the numbers of parents that attended last night and it reaffirms the very positive relationships that exist between home and school. Our administration team will not be calling parents to obtain verbal permission if notes are not returned. Thank you in anticipation of your support.

Swimming Carnival next Wednesday

A reminder that our annual swimming carnival for Years 3-6 students (and exceptional Year 2 swimmers) will be held next Wednesday at Waves Fitness and Aquatic Centre, Baulkham Hills. Students attending the carnival are asked to be at school by 8.00am. Kiss and Drop will be supervised from 7.30am.

Please be aware that the carpark will be congested on this morning as the buses to transport the students to the carnival will be parked in bus lanes. Parking at Castle Towers and walking across to the school may be a quicker option.

Back Gate (Gilham Street entrance)

Please be aware that the back gate to the school will be closed at 9.30am each day and re-opened at 2.30pm each afternoon. The gate will be open before 2.00pm of a Monday afternoon to allow parents to attend assemblies.

Crossing the Pedestrian intersection after school

Following on from my request to parents last week to be safe and follow pedestrian signals when crossing the Les Shore Place and Pennant Street lights, we continue to witness some dangerous behaviour.

To be honest, I have been appalled by the actions of some adults who have placed themselves and their children in significant danger. Yesterday, for example, I witnessed a parent, with their Kindergarten child, run across the roundabout on Les Shore Place and then continued to run up the wrong side of the road to the intersection at Pennant Street.

There is no doubt in my mind that a child will be badly injured or killed if this behaviour continues. I sincerely hope that it will not take a serious incident to occur before a small percentage of our school community accept that the way they either drive or cross the road is dangerous and is teaching our children to be unsafe in and around traffic.

I am currently liaising with local council and Castle Hill police to seek their support in addressing these issues. As a school, we do our best to keep your children safe every day. We cannot be everywhere and rely on our parents and adult community members to demonstrate safe behaviours when travelling to and from school.

Please support us in our efforts to ensure the safety of all of our students.

With the new year beginning and changes to the school year, many families are often worried about not receiving important messages now that their child is in a new grade.



Bebras Challenge

Bebras is an international student Computational Thinking Challenge, and Bebras Australia is run by CSIRO Education and Outreach through the Digital Careers program. The goal is to promote Computational Thinking to students in a way that highlights student ability beyond Science or Maths skills. The challenge complements learning that students engage with in our current curriculums, tapping into problem solving skills of pattern recognition, logic and algorithms.

The challenge runs twice a year, and is open to students in Years 3-6 at the primary school level. Students can enter as an individual or as a team, where collaborative thinking is encouraged.


The first challenge opens for a two-week period in March, and we are seeking expressions of interest from students who would like to participate in this opportunity. The challenge will be completed during the school day, under the supervision of a coordinating teacher.

Robotics

Our robotics program will be commencing later this term. The sessions will run for one **semester** and then students will have the choice to enrol again for the next semester. They will be held before school from 7:45am-8:30am, as detailed below.

Beginner – Monday morning 7:45am-8:30am in the Library with Miss Kendall, Mrs Ambler and Mrs Georgiades
Students enrolling in this session will have little or no experience with robotics and have not participated in the program at Castle Hill Public School previously.

Intermediate – Tuesday morning 7:45am-8:30am in the Library with Miss Brown and Miss Kean

Students enrolling in this session will have completed one semester of robotics at Castle Hill Public School. They will have completed the Lego Mat Challenge.

Advanced – Thursday morning 7:45am-8:30am in Room 3 (KB) with Miss Brown and Mrs Davis

Students will have completed two semesters of robotics at Castle Hill Public School. They will have completed the Colour Maze Challenge or may have participated in the First Lego League last year.

This year notes will be available from your child's class teacher from next Tuesday. Due to space and resource numbers, there is only space for 24 students in each session. Therefore, places will be allocated based on the order the notes are returned to the labelled box in the front office. Please do not pay as this will not secure your child a place in the program.

Our first major sporting event for 2020, the Annual Swimming Carnival, will be held on Wednesday 26 February, at Waves Fitness and Aquatic Centre, 44 Mileham Avenue, Baulkham Hills. Student permission note are due back by Thursday 20 February. Parents are welcome to attend but will be required to pay an entrance fee. Below is some important information about the swimming carnival and items to bring on the day.

- Students must be at school at 8:15am as buses will leave at 8:30am.
- If you normally catch a bus, you may need to be dropped off early.

- Students who are not competing in the carnival will be staying on the grass area. Some novelty events will involve water so make sure you still bring swimmers and a towel.

2020 CHPS SWIMMING CARNIVAL

Dear Parents,

Our first major sporting event for 2020, the Annual Swimming Carnival will be held on **Wednesday 26 February**, at **Waves Fitness and Aquatic Centre**, 44 Mileham Avenue, Baulkham Hills.

All students are asked to be at school by 8.00am and will return in time to catch normal bus services in the afternoon.

The 100m freestyle will be the first event, students need to sign up for this event at school prior to the carnival. **Students** competing in the 100m freestyle race must be at school to be on the first bus at 8.15am.

Buses will leave the school from 8.15am. Kiss & Drop will be operating from 7.30am. Please allow plenty of time as the car park will be congested.

The cost will be \$15.00, which covers pool entry and transport and will be in the Semester One term fees. Please do not pay until you receive the fee notice in Term 2.

Could you please ensure that your child knows his/her date of birth.

JUNIOR events involve children born in 2010, 2011, 2012; 11 YEARS events are for those born in 2009; and SENIOR events are for those students born in 2007 and 2008.

ALL YOUR CHILD'S CLOTHING AND POSSESSIONS TAKEN TO THE POOL SHOULD BE CLEARLY MARKED WITH HIS/HER NAME. Please provide your child with ample food and drink for the day (morning tea, lunch, plastic bottles of water, snacks and fruit). Students will be permitted to buy from the pool kiosk during the day.

Staff members have emergency care and CPR training. We have students in the school who can have anaphylactic reactions to nut products. We would appreciate your consideration and not include any nut products in food provided for the day.

Parents are very welcome to attend as spectators on the day or to assist as a timekeeper. Timekeepers are required to time races with a stopwatch (provided by the school). The morning session is from 8.30am-11.30am and the afternoon session is 11.30am-2.30pm. Parents may request to assist at one or both of these times. Class parents will email further information to families about assisting on the day. Please note, adults who attend the carnival will be required to pay an entry fee at the gate.
