#### **Harmony Week**

We are looking forward to celebrating Harmony Day this Friday March 21. Parents and community members are invited to attend one or both of our Harmony Day parades on our Blue Playground. Students may come to school dressed in cultural clothing, colours representing their cultural background (no football jerseys) or orange — the colour of Harmony Week. #### Baha'i SRE

A reminder to families who may not be aware, that our school offers Baha'i SRE, in addition to SEE (Special Education in Ethics) and non scripture (alternative meaningful activities). Other SRE options are listed on our <u>school website</u>.

#### NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Each year students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN moved to Term 1 last year and this year it is taking place from Wednesday March 12 to Monday March 24.

NAPLAN tests are just one part of our school learning assessment program and questions are primarily based on knowledge, understanding and skills gained from the prior year of schooling.

In preparation for NAPLAN 2025, our school undertook activities to help students become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked.

A reminder that students will need their own pair of headphones for each test. The headphones must be over the head and compatible with iPads (no bluetooth or wireless).

This can be used by students to familiarise themselves with NAPLAN and the types of questions and tools available. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.


