#### **Bus Safety and Travel reminders**

#### A message from Transport NSW

#### Using your school Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

School travel passes are not transferable. Each school travel pass is issued to a specific student and is printed with the eligible student's name. <u>Fines may apply for misuse.</u>

Student must comply with the <u>Student Codes of Conduct</u>.

It is essential for all school students to travel with a valid school travel pass. If you are using a school Opal card, **you must tap on and tap off every time when using public transport to travel to and from school.** This allows us to better understand customer travel patterns and adjust the services provided if necessary.

There are several bus services provided to Castle Hill Public School for our students to travel safely to and from school.

To travel by bus, students are required to have a bus pass. This is in the form of an Opal card. Some students will receive a bus pass, (see below for further information) for other students, parents are required to provide and pay for this bus pass.

The expectation is that students 'tap on' and 'tap off' the bus to and from school. This allows the bus company to determine the number of children who are accessing this service. If students do not have their Opal card for any reason, the bus company will still allow your child on the bus. It is, however, a parent's responsibility to ensure if their children catch the bus, that they have a valid Opal card with sufficient funds to tap on and off.

Currently, the 3628 bus of an afternoon is full once it leaves the school grounds. Over time, we have requested an additional service to reduce crowding. However, to assess the need for an additional service, the bus company will refer to the number of students who have 'tapped on', not the number of students on the bus. Each day, several students access this service without an Opal card which makes it impossible for us to demonstrate the need for an additional service.

We ask for your co-operation in ensuring your child brings their Opal card to school each day if they are catching the bus.

#### Things to know before applying for a bus pass:

#### Applications for 2026 open at the start of Term 4 this year.

You can apply for free school travel for different modes of transport including train, bus, ferry and light rail using the online form.

#### You only need to apply:

- if applying for a school travel pass for the first time.
- if requesting an extra pass due to parents living separately.

#### The student must:

- be a resident of NSW, or an overseas student eligible for free government education.
- be aged 4 years 6 months or older. Pre-school children are not eligible.
- live a minimum distance from your school. The minimum distance varies according to the year or grade the student is enrolled in that calendar year.

#### Who can get a school travel pass?

#### Kindergarten to Year 2 (infants)

• There is no minimum walking distance for these students.

#### Year 3 to Year 6

- The straight-line distance from the student's home address to school is more than 1.6km.
- The walking distance from home to school is 2.3km or further.
